## Combining Sentences—Compound Subjects and Verbs

You know that a **sentence** has a subject and a verb. The subject can be more than one person or thing—**compound subject**. Also, a sentence can be about a subject that is doing more than one thing—**compound verb**.

**Examples:** Joseph and his sister are going out to play in the snow.

Mark went to the store and bought cookies.

## Answers--Combining Sentences—Compound Subjects and Verbs
